



# **Corridor Vision**

- Ongoing collaboration between regional stakeholders










### **Potential Route 39 Roundabout Locations**

#### Route 39 locations

- North 6<sup>th</sup> Street
- Oakhurst Boulevard
- Forest Hills Drive/ Ringneck Dr
- Colonial Club Dr
- Parkway West

• N Progress Ave and Thea Dr






## Potential Route 743 Roundabout Locations


• Route 22 and Sandbeach Road





### Route 39: Route 322 to Patton Road

- Construct a median from Route
  322 to Blue Mountain Commons
  - 4 travel lanes (2 through lanes each direction)
- Widen road from Blue Mountain
  Commons to Patton Road
  - 5 lanes (2 through lanes each direction and a two-way center left turn lane)





### Sidewalk Along Progress Avenue






- Installing sidewalk only on the east side is the short term recommendation
- Installing sidewalk on both sides is the long term recommendation

# Bicycle/Pedestrian Facilities Near Central Dauphin High School

- Balthaser Street to Wenrich Street
  - On-street pavement markings/sharrows
- Wenrich Street to Piketown Road
  - Shared-use path
- Central Dauphin High School to Manor Drive
  - Sidewalk on one side
  - Shoulder widening both sides for bike lane
- Manor Drive to Quality Circle
  - Shoulder widening both sides for bike lane

### Route 39: Jonestown Road to Route 22


- Construct a center left turn lane





### **Alternate Access to Orchard Road**

- Option A: Extend to Sand Beach Road
- Option B: Connect to Shetland Drive





Hayshed Road Extension From Route 39 to Red Top Road





#### Hanover Street Alternatives to Reduce Travel Speeds and Cut-Through Traffic

- Remove channelization
- Add right turn lane
- Slow traffic from Route 39 onto Hanover Street

# Recommended Off-Road Shared-Use Paths


- The west side of Route 39 from Hanshue Road to Grandview Drive
- The east side of Route 39 from Patriot Way to Hanover Street





### **Bicycle Connectivity to Hershey**

- Short Term Hanover Street
- Long Term Replace and widen Route 39 bridge






### **Additional Route 743 Considerations**

- Traffic Calming
  - Signing Enhancements
  - Flashing Signals
  - Roundabouts
  - Enforcement
- Sight Distance concerns
  - Shakespeare House
  - Carriage Stop Bed & Breakfast
- Left Turn Lanes at Farmstead Farmers Market
- Limited-Access Connection



#### Potential I-81 to PA-283/Turnpike Connection

- Connection would reduce traffic volumes on PA-743 and PA-39
- Provides direct access to Hershey from Turnpike
- Would most likely occur from private funding





#### **Upcoming Schedule**

- May 2020 Distribute Final Plan for public review (30-day comment period)
- June 2020 Distribute Final Plan
- Ongoing Adoption and Enforcement by municipalities








